

As a reminder we do have Zelle that you can use for your years dues, just use the treasurer's email. That email is treasurer@tucsonhog.net








Head Road Captain

Person Of Interest

Rex Leetham

Rex was born in Salt Lake City in 1956. He was the youngest of four children, having an older brother Steve (passed away) and two sisters, Merrillyn and Virginia.

Rex had a very good childhood. He was a mischievous boy as boys were back in those days. He was not a destructive kid and was astute in not getting caught doing things he shouldn't have, like throwing tomatoes at cars.

Growing up his family went camping, fishing, hiking and many other activities families did. He stated his dad wasn't rich, but he did not want for anything.



Rex played baseball in school but did not play any instruments. However, his siblings did play instruments. Rex got his first mini bike at 13 years of age which started his love for motorcycles. His father bought his motorcycle from Sears, a Galera. Rex raced in a Soap Box Derby and wanted to go to Ohio to compete but wasn't able to.

While in high school, Rex coached younger boys in baseball. Some 28 years later he met the boy's dad who remembered him and they talked about his coaching and how it helped his son.

Rex never had the desire to go to college after high school. But that all changed in 11th grade because of his civics teacher, Mr. Rasmussen. Mr. Rasmussen told Rex, "College is a test of your endurance, not a test of your knowledge". That tidbit of information stuck in Rex's mind and changed his life.

Rex had a girlfriend in the 11th grade in high school named Linda and their relationship carried over to college for a couple of years. They amicably parted ways. Rex majored in Business with a minor in Public Relations and graduated with a BA from Weber State in Ogden, Utah. He told me he was on a 5-year program for a 4-year degree.

Rex worked for a radio station while in college, KWCR. He received a 4 year scholarship for 4 of his 5 years there as the music director and station manager. In his 5th year at school, he ran for Cultural Vice President and won. His duties were to schedule concerts for the college. He got to schedule bands like Fleetwood Mac (right after the Rumors album came out) and Jethro Tull amongst others. He also scheduled guest lecturers for the college. He said it was a great experience.

After Rex graduated from college, he went to work for Stoke's Brother's Electronics, an electronics retailer. He moved back to Salt Lake City.





After a year or two there the store went out of business. This was at a time when the Big Box Electronics stores came into play and put the smaller guys out of business.

So, Rex then went to work for Price Savers, which later became a store we are all well aware of, Costco. Rex was a buyer for seasonal items and toys and worked there for a couple of years.

He moved on to a reputable firm, "Rocky Mountain Marketing" and worked there for 5 years. He dealt with items like Nintendo, Casio, Packard-Bell computers and other items he could sell to the warehouse stores like Costco.

The last 24 years of his career, Rex worked for a Berkshire Hathaway company called RC Willey. It was a large retailer of furniture, appliances, and electronics. Rex was their TV buyer. This entailed several trips to China, Japan, and Korea. Rex retired in 2020 on the last Friday before the following Monday when Covid hit.

Before leaving the workplace, Rex was introduced to his wife, Tracey, by mutual friends in 1990. They got married a year later on 11-16-91. They didn't have any children together, but Tracey had a 9-year-old daughter named Lindsay. Rex raised her as his own. But Lindsay had Spina Bifida and unfortunately passed away last year in Salt Lake City.

After Rex retired, he got certified to be a substitute teacher. He teaches occasionally when needed for grades K-12.

INJURIES: At 25 years old, Rex tried to do a back flip on a houseboat and his foot slipped causing him to slam his face into the boat breaking out all his front teeth. There was no drinking involved, just a bad accident. It caused three levels of fusion in his neck and back. In 2017, Rex donated a kidney as part of the donors' program.



TRAVELS: Rex has been to approximately 30 of the U.S. states including Alaska and Hawaii. His travels have also taken him to Canada, China, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, France, Germany, Holland, Japan, Korea, Mexico, and Switzerland.

HOBBIES/COLLECTIONS: Rex collects vinyl records and his hobbies include motorcycles, woodworking and his dogs (Lab Mixes).

FAVORITE DRINK: Beer and water.



T-CLOCS Checklist

T - Tires	Condition and Air Pressure, Wheels - spokes, cast look for cracks and dents; Brakes - Function and condition
C - Controls	Handlebars, Levers and Pedals, Cables Hoses and throttle
L - Lights	and electronics, battery, headlamp, tail light, turn signals, switches, mirrors wiring
O – Oil	and other fluids - levels and leaks
C - Chassis	frame, suspension chain and belt
S – Stands	both center and side
